






OLD SCHOOL ROOMS -TO- UPSCALE LIVING ROOMS



CLAREMONT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

- \$10,000,000.00+ Project
- Convert Claremont Elementary School into 23 one, two, and three-bedroom apartment units
- Construct a 32,838 sqft two-story expansion for an additional 27 units
- Re-designated it as a Revitalization Area
- Added it to the National Register of Historic Places
- Historic Tax Credits
- \$635,000.00 from the governor's Affordable and Special Needs Housing Loan
- \$600,000.00 Home Consortium Funds
- 5-Year at 50% Real Estate Tax Grant-back.




HIGH BRIDGE RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT
